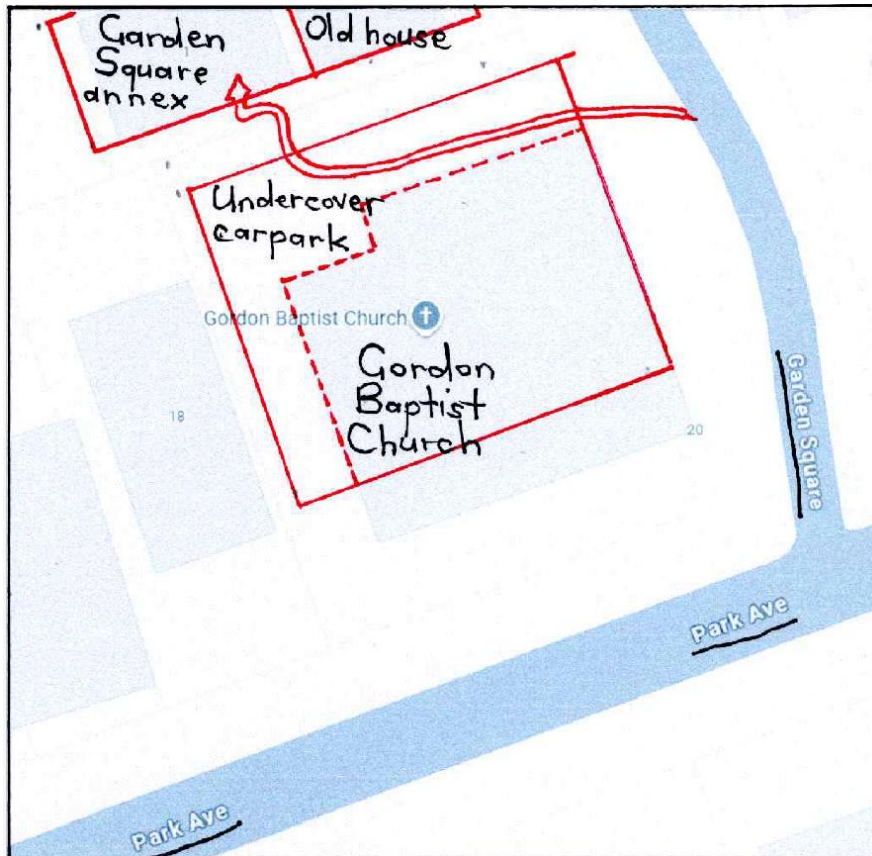


Slight Change of Venue for February Meeting/Presentation

Vale Neil Cameron

A wonderful service of thanksgiving for Dr Neil Cameron, husband of our Presedent Marcia, was held at the Cathedral Church of St Andrew, Sydney on Tuesday 13 January 2026. In excess of 200 people were present. Neil had passed away on Thursday 4 December 2025 The various eulogies presented a wonderful tribute to the life and work of Dr Cameron. Quite a number of our HSA members were there.

Neil was an active member of the Huguenot Society of Australia for more than twenty years, having been a member since 2003. He was a keen church organist and played at many of our annual Huguenot heritage church services. He has given talks at meetings about musical and associated hymnal issues. Neil was a well-known Sydney solicitor and a member of the General Synod of the Anglican Church of Australia continuously from 1973 to 2014. He served on the Synod Standing Committee, including contributing his expertise on the Church Law Commission during the period when the Canons of 1603 were revised for Australian use.

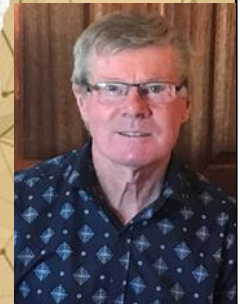

More Huguenot Presentations

Apart from presentations delivered at our Huguenot Society of Australia meetings, there were a number of other recent opportunities to hear about the Huguenots. Here are a couple of events recently held:

8 October 2025 (5.30pm): Pamela Summers – ***The Huguenots and the French Reformation*** (for Moore Theological College – at the Donald Robinson Library, 1 King Street, Newtown NSW. In person and online.). This was an excellent presentation, and the videorecording is in the members only section of this website.

13 October 2025 (10.00am): Neil Renaud - ***The Huguenots and the Huguenot Background of Jacob Bellett*** (for the Garth and Bellett Family Gathering/Reunion – at The Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania, Marievilla Esplanade, Sandy Bay, Hobart). The text and slides from the second part of this presentation will soon be placed in the members only section of this website.

(Jacob Bellett was a silk weaver and Huguenot descendant, one of at least three Huguenot descendants on the First Fleet. He was almost certainly descended from Thomas Bellet and Judith Le Sauvage from Normandy, who arrived in London in 1687. Jacob, as a nineteen-year-old, was sentenced to seven years' transportation for stealing lining silk, unwound thread and wound silk.)
